Huncote Parish Council Chairman's Report - May 2023

Since my last report of May 2022, no-one could have foreseen the many changes that have occurred within such a short period of time.

Firstly, there were the magnificent celebrations in honour of Queens Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee. So many villagers ventured out for the lighting of the beacon on the Croft hill embankment, a scene mirrored across the country. However, this was sadly followed by the death of her Majesty on 8th September. Our parishioners wrote in the book of remembrance which was placed in Huncote St James parish church where the village held a minutes silence in respect for the death of our late Queen. I then had the honour of reading the proclamation of King Charles III's accession to the throne.

Last year, we had the resignation of 2 prime ministers - Boris Johnson, closely followed by Liz Truss. This resulted in Rishi Sunak being elected as leader of the Conservative party and subsequently, Prime Minister.

The war in Ukraine, due to Russia's invasion, and the recent civil conflicts in Sudan are having an impact right across the world. Refugees are forced to flee war zones and financial poverty. These upheavals, alongside the extreme weather conditions affecting food production, have had a financial and moral impact on us all.

We are very fortunate in Huncote that we have a strong caring community. The Huncote Knitters, have put up some fantastic displays throughout the year. We live in an area where people can get out into the countryside for walks, and we have many active groups you can join in with, which can help bring some normality to our lives. Unfortunately, the footpaths around the Leisure Centre and Leisure Centre field are still not open to public use. I am hopeful that at some point we will receive information of their re-opening.

Our litter Wombles continue to regularly clear the litter throughout the village. The footpath to Narborough appears to be an area where motorists throw their rubbish from their car windows as they drive along. Disappointingly, dog fouling seems to be on the increase in our village. We all know it is the dog owners responsibility to clean up their dog litter and dispose of in the available bins. Wouldn't it be great if we could all be a bit more considerate?

We have replaced the goal posts on the recreation ground and are still pursuing the repair of the zip-line which is proving to be a very onerous task. Mysteriously, it appears that there are no parts available for the repairs!

I would like to thank all our parish councillors who have put themselves forward for election and have subsequently been reelected. There were only the 6 existing councillors putting themselves forward for election so there remains 2 parish council vacancies should anyone wish to join our great team on your council.

Congratulations to Maggie Wright, who has been re-elected as the District Councillor for Huncote.

Finally, King Charles III was crowned on 6 May, 2023 at Westminster Abbey with all the pomp and ceremony that the British seem to excel at.

New memorial garden statue officially opened

The Parish Council recently worked with EMH Homes Garden Services team to mark the 80th anniversary of the Dambusters raids, which took place during World War II; 16-17 May 1943. The team had worked with the Parish Council back in 2014 to create a memorial to mark 100 years since the start of World War I, and as this needed redeveloping, the council asked them if they could support us to mark the anniversary of the Dambusters raids.



The team worked with the Parish Council to create a model of a Lancaster bomber. These were the planes used during the raids. An artist was



commissioned to create the model from treated spruce pine, providing a sustainable solution which will last around 5 years, giving the residents of Huncote an opportunity to use the memorial garden to commemorate another historic event in the future. The model has now been installed in the garden, and it makes a fantastic impact. Well done to everyone involved in this project!

Do you know where your old stamps are? They're not valid after 31 July 2023

Royal Mail are adding barcodes to all regular stamps.

This means that after 31 July 2023 all regular stamps without a barcode will

be invalid. This



is an extension to the previous deadline of 31 January 2023, giving people more time to use up their old stamps, or post them to Royal Mail to swap them out for shiny new barcoded ones.

If you have a stash of stamps at home or work, you can't use them for postage but you cam swap them for new barcoded ones.

Inconsiderate parking causing issues for pedestrians and emergency services

As a helpful reminder and warning to those that aren't aware, in England parking on pavements is legal, unless specifically restricted, however wilfully obstructing the free passage along a highway, and causing or permitting a motor vehicle or trailer to stand on a road so as to cause any unnecessary obstruction of the road, are both criminal offences which the police can enforce against.

While parking onto pavements may be necessary on some narrow roads to allow emergency services to pass when necessary, please also think of how pedestrians can pass when you do park on the pavement. Is there enough room for a pushchair/wheelchair to pass safely? In <u>a recent government study</u> 95% of visually impaired people/98% of wheelchair users had had a problem with vehicles parked on pavements, resulting in 32% of respondents with vision impairments/48% wheelchair users were less willing to go out on their own because of pavement parking. Please think about how you park, and if you're causing an obstruction. Anyone wishing to report obstructive parking should contact the police via 101.

Dogs being let loose on field off Peers Way

Residents have been raising concerns about dogs being let loose on the farmers field off Peers Way, where they are roaming freely and owners are not collecting after them. Footpath V121 does go through the field, which leads over the Thurlaston Brook into the nature walk, near the pond, but the right of way is only 3 feet wide around the edge of the field, and not the whole of the field.

We would like to remind all dog walkers that you should be in control of your dog at all times and stick to official footpaths, not straying into farmers fields.
